Split along party lines, many Republicans felt that forty-two cents for a half gallon of milk was a solid consumer bargain, while Democrats pointed out that sixty-seven cents for a pound of bacon was too expensive for many. Since the average U.S. worker now earns a record annual wage of \$3,107.00, many members of the House felt that fourteen cents for a loaf of bread was quite affordable.

Vice-President Alben W. Barkley noted that while ten pounds of potatoes had risen to fifty-five cents, he said that the American public had, in 1949, more buying power than ever before.
